Dear WACO Board Members:

I am writing on behalf of the Hagen Family to express our sincere gratitude for the effort of WACO generally, and Lori Severson specifically, for the assistance in obtaining the permitting for our new pool.

Pride of America began construction of an additional 2000 square foot pool adjacent to our existing pool. Despite the poor weather this spring we were able to complete construction and schedule the final (construction) inspection with the DSPS on May 14. During that inspection it was discovered that the pool was in violation of the code even though it was built exactly to plans that were approved by the DSPS. The remedy was for us to modify the pool slightly and apply for a variance which was complete on the 17<sup>th</sup>, awaiting final approval. It became clear to us that DSPS was in no hurry and probably going to take the full 30 days allowed to grant approval. After a call to Lori she initiated a full court press using relationships that WACO has developed in the state government. As a result we had the variance approved on the 22<sup>nd</sup>. She also was able to secure a special trip by a Health Inspector on the 25<sup>th</sup> who granted us the license to open for the Memorial Day weekend!

I tell this story because it highlights the benefits of belonging to an organization like WACO that fosters the relationships required to cut through the red tape of government and allows us to do what we do best – run our parks. I think many people overlook this aspect of “value” when considering joining the Association. Thank you again for your commitment to our industry.

# Pool Safeguards: Chemical Release Prevention

**Subject:** Pool Safeguards: Chemical Release Prevention

As you know, chemical release events account for over half of the hospitalizations related to pool medical emergency events and continue to be a growing problem in the Wisconsin pool industry. The safeguards within the pump room are critical design and equipment items that directly prevent chemical releases related to the over-feeding of large quantities of chlorine and/or acid in the circulation system.

The department has determined that this critical health and safety issue requires evaluation and enforcement during all inspections. As a result the following will be required:

-Pool disinfection systems that have been converted from erosion to liquid disinfection systems will still follow the same safeguard test protocols and will be required to submit plans to DSPS within 90 days for the conversion of the disinfectant system if they have not obtained DSPS approval as the 2016 letter indicates. Rather than initial closure when the safeguards tests fail, the enforcement protocol will be changed to a less strict requirement of a noted violation of ATCP 76.13 during the inspection and will require a reinspection within 30 days for the verification of installation and operation of the safeguards. The pool will be able to remain open during this time. If after the 30 days, the safeguards are not in place or operational, the pool will be closed.

-Pools that have not converted their disinfection systems are still required to have safeguards outlined in ATCP 76.13 regardless of date of construction as this is again an important design and equipment items that is an imminent health and safety prevention method of chemical release events. Similar to the steps mentioned above, the pool operator will demonstrate the safeguard test procedures during an inspection to illustrate that the safeguards are in place and operational. If one of the safeguards are not present or operational, the pool will be noted in violation of ATCP 76.13, can remain open, but will have 30 days to correct the imminent hazard. A reinspection will be conducted after that 30 day period to verify that the safeguards. If they are not in place or operational, the pool will be closed.

Future communication: Another letter, similar to the one issued in 2016, will be sent out to all state and agent staff along with all 4,000+ pool operators notifying them of the conditions outlined above. Additional training materials will be issued to inspection staff AND also be made available to pool operators. Once these have been completed, a communication will be issued on SharePoint, announcing the new material.

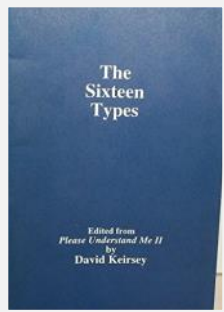

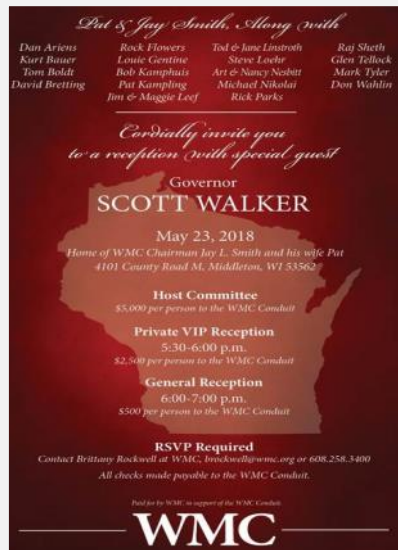


## Text Club

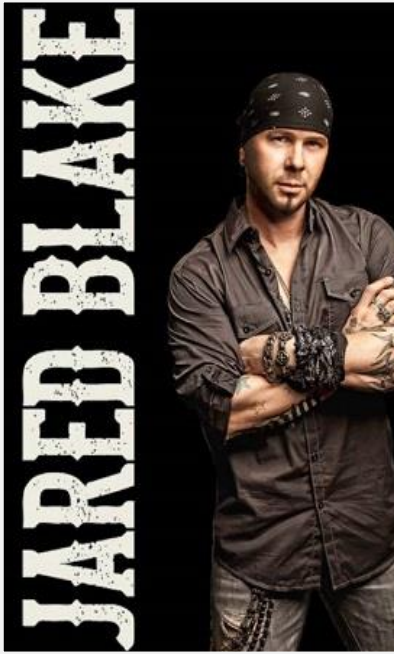

## Obituary for William Arnold Schroeder

William Arnold 'Bill' Schroeder, 65, of Richland Center formerly of Madison, passed away peacefully at home on Monday, June 18, 2018 following a short journey with cancer.
