Dear Campground Owners:

Thanks to timely and effective advocacy from the WACO, the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection has decided not to close all campgrounds. They did so because WACO was able to explain that a well-operated campground is reasonably safe for guests under guidelines ordered by the Governor. I am writing this letter because it is essential for every campground to appreciate that the Department's action can be reversed instantly if we do not completely follow the guidelines. Health and human life are at issue here!

WACO has received a flood of recommended best practices. WACO will review these and relay them to you. Every campground is different and needs to implement the safety precautions effectively. Make sure that your staff, especially seasonal staff, are carefully and thoroughly oriented to the restrictions that apply. If facilities or campgrounds cannot be operated in a sanitary manner, we urge you to err on the side of human health and close the facilities or even the campground. Please note that policies cannot entirely eliminate risks.

This season will provide a different camping experience from what you have offered in the past. Communicate with your campers early and clearly so they know what to expect. It is better to give them ample warning than to have them be disappointed when they arrive.

As stated in my memo from Thursday, March 19, do not make any promises to your campers about the results of your efforts. Just tell them what you will do. Let them make decisions on their own behalf. No one is in the position to assure anyone that they will be "safe." You can tell your customers that you will be sanitizing the public areas when you know they have been used, with approved cleaning chemicals. No one can tell them doing so is enough to prevent contagious diseases.

We have the chance to have a season for 2020 because Wisconsin campgrounds have a good track record of protecting the health and safety of our campers. We have handled nasty and dangerous things for years, such as transfer tanks and greywater. We have complied with safety

standards in managing food preparation. We know how to be careful. We have to do that to a higher level of fastidiousness than ever before seen in our campgrounds. There is no margin for error.

Let's show them what you are capable of doing!
