	✓ Describe how to know if pump has stopped or if there is a chemical leak

	✓ Explain when to backwash	
	✓ Explain annual sand inspection (sand filters only)	
	✓ Explain how controller is maintained or who handles this duty

	✓ Entries self-closing, latching, lockable (test closure)	
	✓ First aid kit stocked, blanket, all in pool area (or within 25 feet of pool area, with signage posted)	
	✓ Biohazard cleanup kit on premises	
	✓ Shepherd's crook present (all pool facilities) and long enough to reach anywhere in pool (non-lifeguarded facilities only)	
	✓ Ring buoy and rescue tube for pools 30 feet or wider or lifeguarded	
	✓ Drinking fountain functional	
	✓ Pool rules posted (newest rule for children under 12 at a non-lifeguarded pool)	
	✓ Signage or alternate related to prohibiting breath holding games	
	✓ Area clean and well-drained	
	✓ Carbon monoxide detector for indoor pool areas (if fuel burning appliance in adjacent pump room)	
Pool Basin	✓ Inlets moving water to help skimming	
	✓ Main drain covers and skimmer equalizer covers	
	✓ Water clear	
	✓ Skimmers cleaned and water flowing into skimmer (or water flowing over gutter for a pool with gutters)	
	✓ Weir doors present/in good repair

Restrooms and showers	✓ Cleaned and stocked with toilet paper, soap, hand drying at handwash sinks)	
Pump Room	✓ Chemical labeled, especially with at least common name (example, clearly labeled 'acid' and 'chlorine')	Pool Chemical Safety Fact Sheet (P-DFRS-02020)
	✓ Chemicals separated as much as possible	Pool Chemical Safety Fact Sheet (P-DFRS-02020)
	✓ Automatic disinfectant feed online	
	✓ Recirculation pump is on	
	✓ Pressure gage on filter present and working	
	✓ Flowmeter is working	
	✓ Skimmer and main drain settings so most of water is coming from skimmers
